Inspired by Gospel values, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic lay organization, leads women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder, Blessed Frédéric Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul.

Organized locally, Vincentians witness God's love by embracing all works of charity and justice. The Society collaborates with other people of good will in relieving need and addressing its causes, making no distinction in those served because, in them, Vincentians see the face of Christ.

Vincentian Members

Membership in the United States totals more than 150,000 in 4,300 communities. The Society is present in 156 of 194 dioceses (80 percent). Active membership increased by over 2,000 from 2012.

Each Day throughout the U.S., Vincentians

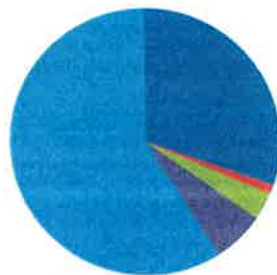
- Conducted 2,861 service visits to help the poor and needy
- Visited 1,477 households to offer material and spiritual help
- Offered 940 people spiritual aid (prayed with clients, distributed Bibles, rosaries, etc.)
- Referred 913 people to appropriate agencies for help
- Provided other services to help 445 people
- Made 306 visits to those in eldercare facilities
- Met with the sick in 160 hospitals
- Assisted 146 travelers in distress
- Made 53 visits to minister to those in prison
- Helped 6 people obtain jobs

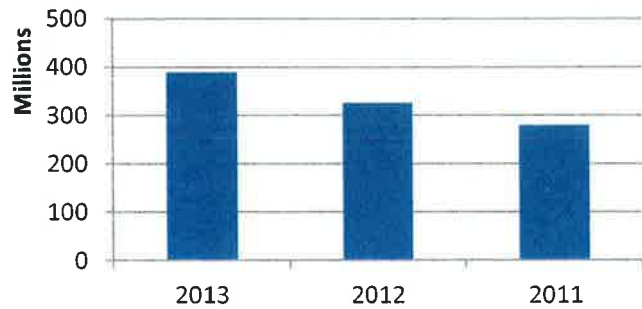

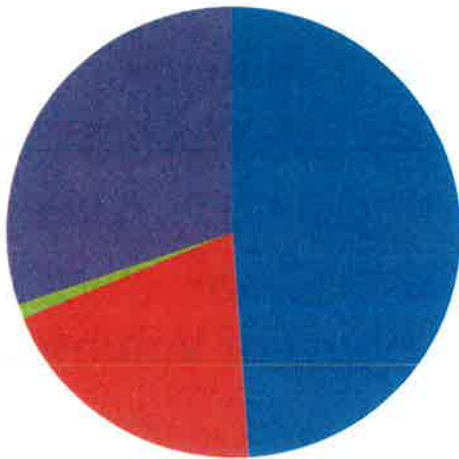
